Visitors to the Open House are welcome to the **closing reception for the work of photographer Brian Maguire**. His 64 exquisite





From Route 2, take Exit 58 for Arlington's Park Ave. Follow Park Ave. to Massachusetts Ave. Continuing across Massachusetts Ave., take first right on Lowell Street. Proceed past Water Mill Place on left and the take a left on Mill Lane.

Public Transportation: Take #77 bus from the Harvard Square Red Line T-Station Bus Terminal and get off at the Appleton Place stop (1201 Massachusetts Avenue. Walk up Massachusetts Ave, take a right on Lowell Street and a right onto Mill Lane.
